#### **BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH**

Willis Evan "Bill" Kuhn (15 August 1897–14 February 1977) was born in Anderson, Hamilton County, Ohio, to Willis Johnson Kuhn and Hildegarde Frenzdorf Kuhn. He was one of five children.

Kuhn left home at age sixteen to work as a mechanic's helper in Cincinnati, Ohio. He took jobs with automobile companies in both Cincinnati and Detroit before purchasing the North Side Chevrolet franchise in Indianapolis, Indiana, in 1932. He eventually had locations on the west side (3015 W. Washington St.), Irvington (5436 E. Washington St.), Downtown (540-544 E. Washington St.), as well as the original Broad Ripple location (836 E. 63<sup>rd</sup> St). Kuhn opened a fully modernized North Side Chevrolet dealership and service shop at 1045 Broad Ripple Avenue in August 1950.

Kuhn served as an ordinance training officer during World War II. In the larger community, he served on a variety of boards including the American Fletcher National Bank and Trust Co. and Converse College, as well as participating in Boys' Club work and Community Chest campaigns in Indianapolis.

Willis Kuhn married Jacquelyn Montague (7 August 1898–4 July 1985) in Hamilton County, Ohio, on 21 January 1925.
