BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

John P. Franz was a physician practicing in downtown Indianapolis, Indiana, in the early 1900s. John was born in Indianapolis on 7 October 1860 to German immigrants John and Margaret Franz. John's father was a laborer and when time came for John to get a job, he found work as a cigar maker. A few years into this work, John decided to get a higher education. He graduated from the American Medical College of Indianapolis in 1897 and was the first candidate for an Indiana State Medical Exam before the state board.

In John's personal life, he spent several years as a divorcee before he married his second wife, Ada Millspaugh Veatch (1864–1930) on 17 August 1908. While the couple had no children of their own, Ada had a child named Dora Belle Veatch from her previous marriage. Dora had two children, William Gaddis and Violet Gaddis (later Morris).

John Franz died on 18 October 1929.
