## **BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH**

**Edward Salyards** (13 March 1845–7 October 1932) was born in Ohio. By his teenage years he resided in Orleans, Indiana. Salyards served as a war correspondent to the 24th Indiana Infantry. His rank is listed as musician. His unit was part of the siege of Vicksburg. Salyards married Eleanor Ellen Nolan Anderson. They had three sons: William Edward Salyards on 11 February 1869, Roy Guy Salyards on 16 June 1877, and Nolan Jacobs Salyards on 17 September 1888. They had a daughter, Pearl Edith Salyards, on 8 August 1879.

**Tileston Brothers Photographists** -- There was a photography office located at No. 50 Main Street, Evansville, Indiana, in the 1860s according to a stamp on the back of one of the photographs.
