HISTORICAL SKETCH

George Alig, Sr. (24 February 1852–17 January 1941) was born in Switzerland. He moved to Indianapolis in 1871. He became involved in the Indianapolis Stove Company in 1875, acting as vice president. In 1893, he sold his share in the Indianapolis Stove Company and formed his own stove-making business, the Home Stove Company. At its peak, Alig's company employed over 300 women and distributed its products throughout the country. The company was known for its steel and cast-iron ranges, stoves, cook tops, and heaters.

Alig married Cornelia Charlotte Schirmer on 8 January 1878. They had five sons and two daughters between 1879 and 1891. Alig's oldest son, George Alig, Jr., would eventually take over the company upon his father's retirement. The business remained in the family during the next generation as well. George Alig, Jr.'s son Daniel also worked for the company.
