HISTORICAL SKETCH

The Hoosier Building was a proposed Indianapolis construction under consideration in 1959. This project was to be located at Market and Illinois streets and had an estimated cost of \$580,877.00. The investors for this project were the Spann Company and Mansur Realty Company; the architecture firm in charge of the project was Allen and Kelley Architects and Engineers.

Allen and Kelley Architects and Engineers was founded by Joseph Lloyd Allen (1897–1975) and John Robert Kelley (1902–1991). Before founding this firm, the two had worked independently. Allen and Kelley was known largely for industrial architecture, however, they also worked on housing projects, theaters, and commercial buildings, such as The Hoosier Building. John Kelley retired from the firm in 1960. After Kelley's retirement, Joseph Allen continued the firm under the name J. Lloyd Allen until 1967.
