## **BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH**

Janelda June Clayton Stafford (January 6, 1923-February 18, 1965) was born to Russell Clayton and Marie Craig in Charleston, West Virginia. Janelda spent most of her formative years in Ashland, Kentucky and then worked as a plant nurse for Owen-Illinois Inc., a glass bottle manufacturer. In 1943, Janelda settled in Muncie, Indiana with her husband, Marine veteran Charles E. Stafford. The couple had two daughters, Elizabeth and Linda, and owned Gayee Sales Company, which sold health and beauty aids. Janelda was also involved in Women of the Moose, Chapter 712, a community service and social fraternity, and the Beta Rho Chapter of Epsilon Sigma Alpha, a service organization, as well as the Licensed Practical Nurses Association.
