BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Mildred Baker first began attending school at six years old. She went to Haughville School, which would later become IPS #53. Mildred attended Haughville during World War I. Haughville taught students in the first through sixth grades. The two-story school building only had four rooms. As a result, different grades shared a classroom. After going to Haughville, Mildred attended IPS #52 for junior high. Mildred went to Manual Training High School after that, but dropped out after her first year.
