## **BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH**

Thomas J. Pound (1846–1911) was born near Seward, Kosciusko County, Indiana. In January 1864, he enlisted in Company G of the 128th Indiana Regiment. Pound enlisted from Fulton County, Indiana, in order to help fill the county's quota and was to receive the sum of \$200 for doing so. Pound was mustered out in May 1865, and returned to Kosciusko County where he farmed. In 1871, he married Mary Ann Smith and they produced three children. In the 1870s, the Pounds left Kosciusko County and settled in Fillmore, Bollinger County, Missouri, where he continued to farm until his death.

## **SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE**

The collection consists of four documents pertaining to Thomas Pound's bounty for filling the quota for Fulton County, Indiana, in 1864. There are two checks from Harrison County one of \$50.00 and another of \$100.00 made out S.K. Wolfe, county agent, for the "expenses of volunteering, 11 February 1865, and redeemed by E. H. Richard on 2 April 1866.

The other two items deal with Pound's pension. There is a certification from the Adjutant General's office stating that Pound served in the Union Army and helped fill the quota from Henry Township, Fulton County, 5 September 1867. The final document is a suit brought by Pound against the Fulton County Auditor for the \$200 he was owed, 18 September 1867.
