BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Mary Jane "Majie" Alford Zaring Failey was born in New York City in 1922 to Herbert Alford and Dorothy Heaton. When a young child, the family returned to Indianapolis, where she spent her formative years. She attended Tudor Hall as well as Shortridge High School before graduating from Dana Hall in Wellesley, Massachusetts. After graduating from Indiana University in 1945, she took the position of Society Editor with the *Indianapolis News*. She married William S. Zaring in 1946 and then William H. C. "Skip" Failey in 1962. She has three children, William A. Zaring, Catherine A. Zaring Boll, and Gaye A. Zaring Mueller, as well as two stepsons, William H. Failey and John N. Failey. Besides her many contributions to the *Indianapolis News*, Ms. Failey has written and published two books—one about her newspaper writing experiences and Indianapolis society (*Forgive Us Our Press Passes: A Society Editor's Prayer*) and the other about her friend, Indiana author Kurt Vonnegut (*We Never Danced Cheek to Cheek*). She currently resides in Indianapolis, Indiana.
