BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Samuel C. Sweet was born in Cincinnati, Ohio on 3 January 1831. Sweet was a school teacher until he enlisted for service in the Civil War on 18 August 1862. He served as a sergeant in Company F of the 101st Indiana Volunteer Regiment. Sweet was discharged in Louisville, Kentucky on 24 June 1865 and sent to Indianapolis. Once home, he returned to teaching. In November 1865, Sweet married Albina T. Williams and they had six children. In 1881, he married Mary E. Mills. Twenty years after his service, Sweet wrote a poem about his experiences, titled "Sherman's Raid in Georgia." He died in Wabash, Indiana on 25 September 1909. He was buried in Ogan Cemetery, which is now Mississinewa Memorial Cemetery.
