BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Tine Payton Dickenson was born in Illinois in May 1888 to William Dickenson and Callie B. Laflen. By the age of 22, Tine was a boarder in the home of William A. Rosemeyer and Sarah E. Large in Indianapolis, Indiana. A year later, Tine married their daughter, Ethel A. Rosemeyer. He worked as a bookkeeper and secretary treasurer in the tool manufacturing and machinist industries. Tine died in 1937 and was buried in Crown Hill Cemetery. His widow, Ethel, remarried on 17 February 1950 to Frank Adney.

Walter was a relative of Tine Dickenson. Walter was a member of the 11th cavalry of U.S. Volunteers stationed in the Philippines during the Philippine-American War.
