#### **BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH**

Agnes Search was born 24 June 1905 to Charles and Constance Search in Indianapolis, Indiana. She attended the Clemens Vonnegut School, Arsenal Technical High School, and the Normal College of the American Gymnastic Union. In 1925, Agnes married Oral Bridgford, who was also a teacher. After graduating from the Normal College, she taught at the Claire Ann Shooer Nursery School. Agnes gave birth to Peter William Bridgford on 17 January 1934. In 1937 Agnes began working at the Meridian Heights Presbyterian Kindergarten and eventually became director. At the same time, Agnes took classes at Butler University and received her bachelor of science in 1951. Agnes also is credited with helping initiate the kindergarten system in Washington Township and was Nora's first kindergarten teacher. In 1971, Agnes retired and began volunteering. She worked the recruiting station for the Daughters of the American Revolution and ran a pilot program at Greenbriar School. She did volunteer work at the soup kitchen in All Saint's Episcopal Church and the art museum's gift shop. Agnes also helped organize the Alliance of the James Whitcomb Riley Home and worked as a docent at the Riley home for 25 years. She was a Board Member and registrar for the Indianapolis Shepherd Center. Agnes' husband, Oral, died 1 June 1980. Agnes continued to be active in the community until 2001. She died 13 July 2006.
