16 Panels


- ➔ Each panel is 3' wide x 7' high.
- ➔ The panels are printed fabric over metal frames.
- ➔ Panels are single sided (blank on reverse).
- ➔ The panels connect together magnetically.
- ➔ Requires approx. 200-250 sq. feet of floor space.




Sample Layouts

Typical setup is 4 sections (each containing 4 panels), but additional layout options and configurations are available. **Please Note:** Individual panels are not free-standing. At least two panels must be connected together to stand upright.


Four Squares
(placed in center of room)




Overhead View




Linear One-Sided

Overhead View




Linear Back-to-Back
(placed in center of room)




Overhead View
