A new touring exhibit, <u>The American Revolution Experience</u>, will travel to four sites in Indiana in early 2025. The exhibit is a collaborative project of the American Battlefield Trust and the Daughters of the American Revolution. The exhibit will visit these Indiana sites:

- Jan. 9-18, Alexandria Madison County Farm Bureau 4-H Building
- Feb. 3-12, Brookville Franklin County Courthouse
- Feb. 14-28, Franklin Johnson County Museum of History
- March 1-12, Madison Madison-Jefferson County Public Library
