You are cordially invited to the continuation of our Great Conversation Series featuring Robert Woodson and selections from The Remnant Trust of seminal documents about liberty and dignity: a 1st printing of The Federalist Papers 1788 or a Magna Carta manuscript from 1350; works by Frederick Douglass and a 1st printing of the United States Constitution; John Calvin's Institutes from 1536 and John Locke's Second Treatise on Government and many others.

Featuring Woodson, civil rights activist, social commentator and winner of a MacArthur "genius" grant, who has done extensive work in Indianapolis through the Woodson Center (formerly Center for Neighborhood Enterprise). He will explore the Founding using key Trust works as well as through the lens of the Center's Project 1776 Unites. Woodson is based in Washington, D.C., where he has advised Presidents, Congress and the broader policymaking community on the needs and concerns of African-Americans and low-income Americans of all races.

1776 Unites is a movement to positively shape the American future by drawing on the best of its past. Radically pragmatic and unapologetically patriotic, it offers—through its essays and curricula—an inspirational and aspirational alternative to the prevailing narrative of racial grievance being perpetuated by an alarming number of businesses, schools, and government institutions. Further, 1776 Unites is a nonpartisan and intellectually diverse alliance of writers, thinkers, and activists focused on solutions to our country's greatest challenges in education, culture, and upward mobility.

The Remnant Trust, recently relocated to Indianapolis, is an educational foundation committed to elevating educational standards and the public's understanding of individual liberty and human dignity through the precedent setting, hands on availability of the world's great ideas in original form. Its 1,500-volume Wisdom of the Ages Athenaeum dating to 2,500 BCE is drawn from four continents and 12 languages. It is among the world's best privately-funded collections focused on the ideas and ideals of liberty.
