World War II: The Largest Art Theft in History

The initial shipment of stolen artifacts from France to Germany filled thirty railcars. Between 1933 and 1945, the total number of works plundered from museums and citizens in Austria, Czechoslovakia, Poland, Belgium, Luxembourg, Denmark, Yugoslavia, Greece, Germany, Russia, Norway, and the Netherlands has been estimated at between 650,000 and 1,000,000. Stealing Renoir, is Brown's first novel about this event, followed by Stealing Picasso. The third book in the art/mystery series, Saving Van Gogh, will be available in 2024.

Hoosier Authors

Subject: Authors

Description: Hoosier Authors tells about the lives and writings of famous authors from Indiana including James Whitcomb Riley, Gene Stratton Porter, Johnny Gruelle, General Lew Wallace, Kurt Vonnegut and Jim Davis. All Hoosier programs require a DVD player or laptop computer connected to either a big-screen TV or a projector and a screen or white wall on which to project photos. There must be the ability to pause on each photo. Speaker prefers to have host organization provide carousel slide projector, table, extension cord and screen, but the speaker can provide them if necessary. A 40-minute DVD presentation is available if the group has a DVD-player and a large-screen TV available or a laptop computer with a projector and screen. Presentation times do not include question-and-answer time.
