BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Algernon Sydney Sullivan (1826–1887) was born in Madison, Jefferson County, Indiana. He moved to Cincinnati, Ohio, and attended Miami University in 1845. Soon after, he began practicing law in New York City which he continued to do until his death. In 1855 he married Mary Hammond (b. 1836) in Frederick, Virginia. They had one son, George H. (b. 1860).

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The collection consists of three folders:

The first folder contains a telegraph sent by Algernon Sullivan in Cincinnati to Midshipman Jeremiah Sullivan, In it he states that his letters are keeping him good spirits, 21 December 1848.

The second folder contains legal related correspondence that came from Sullivan's law practice before moving to New York City. In it are deeds, bills of sale, and wills regarding clients in Indiana and Ohio, 1796–1868.

The third folder contains empty envelopes addressed to Algernon Sydney Sullivan as well as a telegram to him from 30 January 1854 and a note from John H. Sullivan thanking him for \$199.00, 18 August 1864.
