BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Mildred Estella Moore was born in 1882 in Ohio to Aquilla and Louise Moore, but lived in Rush County, Indiana for the majority of her life. She married William M. Amos in 1911. Mildred and William had four children: Mildred Elizabeth, Anna Louise, Robert H., and Margaret J.

Mildred Elizabeth (Betty) Amos Van Brunt, their first child, was born in 1911. She attended Butler University and graduated in 1935 with a degree in Journalism. She later married Robert Van Brunt.

William M. Amos was born in 1881 in Indiana to Johanan M. and Estella D. Amos. William was born and raised in Rush County, Indiana, and spent his adulthood working as a farmer. He died in 1965, and his wife, Mildred, died in 1978.
