BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Arthur Earl Hudson (1899-1970) was born on March 19, 1899 in Boonville, Indiana. His parents were Wesley (1872-1949) and Fannie Goad Hudson (1875-1960). He had two brothers, Albert K. (1902-1930) and Delbert (1905-1960). On the 1917 draft card, he listed threshing as his occupation. He married Nellie Mae Holmes (1899-1989) on September 29, 1920. They had three children, Earl E. (1921-2012), Harold E. (1922-1991) and Bernard J. (1928-2008). When filling out his draft card in 1942, he listed Knox Consolidated Coal Company as his employer. He worked as a coal miner. He died from a heart attack on June 2, 1970, in Bicknell, Indiana. He is buried in Memorial Park Cemetery in Vincennes, Indiana.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The photos were taken on a farm circa 1939. Many of the photos contain a tractor and a farming activity. The people in the photos are unidentified. Only one has writing on the back, "A. E. Hudson's single engine with Spottie standing on the tank. Taken June 25-39." One photo was printed by The Foto Finishing Laboratories in Boonville, Indiana. One photo was stamped with "Hudson, Oakland City, Indiana". These are the indicators of location and timeframe for the photos. In the succession of photos, the men appear to be using the tractors to collect and pile hay near a barn. One photo has a tractor that has been overturned. Another has a tractor crossing a bridge.
