BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Blanche Stillson (1889-1977), artist, author, and cultural leader, was born in Indianapolis, graduated from DePauw University (1911), and attended Herron School of Art in Indianapolis. She taught art and painting at Herron, IU-Indianapolis (now IUPUI), Butler University, and Shortridge High School (1928-1939). In addition to exhibiting her woodcuts and paintings at numerous shows, her works also appeared in books, newspapers, greeting cards, bookplates, and other published materials. In 1944 she was elected as a trustee of the Art Association of Indianapolis (now the Indianapolis Museum of Art) and was a member of the board of directors for many years, serving as the organization's vice-president in 1959. Stillson is probably best known nationally for her book *Wings* (1954), a work on birds, but she also co-authored Abe Martin-Kin Hubbard (1939), and wrote a weekly art column for the Indianapolis News from 1923-1925.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

Stillson's papers contain personal letters with a number of friends, including Booth and Susanah Tarkington, regarding general topics as well as literary and artistic subjects (1911-1976). There are also copies of her woodcuts and art works in addition to those of other artists such as George Jo and Evelynne Mess (See: OM 0372, George Jo Mess Srcapbook). There is also information about Stillson's woodcuts including whom, how, and where they were used, as well as posters, greeting cards, and newspaper clippings of hers and others works. Also included are items regarding Wings including correspondence with the publisher, a scrapbook of reviews and other printed material, readers impressions, and page proofs, note cards, and a loose copy of the book (1954-1969).
