## **SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE**

This collection contains a certificate addressed to Private Charles Ruckersfeldt of the 132<sup>nd</sup> Regiment Indiana Volunteer Infantry. Ruckersfeldt received the "President's Thanks and Certificate of Honorable Service" for volunteering his service for 100 days in order to aid General Sherman's campaign. The certificate has stamped signatures of President Abraham Lincoln and Secretary of War Edwin M. Stanton.
