BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Charles S. True was from Fort Wayne, Allen County, Indiana. On 7 August 1862 he enlisted as a sergeant in Company E, 88th Indiana Regiment. True was promoted to 1st lieutenant in January 1863 and was mustered out in June 1865. True moved to Coquille, Oregon after the war.
