## **BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH**

Charles S. True was from Fort Wayne, Allen County, Indiana. On 7 August 1862 he enlisted as a sergeant in Company E, 88<sup>th</sup> Indiana Regiment. True was promoted to 1<sup>st</sup> lieutenant in January 1863 and was mustered out in June 1865. True moved to Coquille, Oregon after the war.

True writes from Greyville, Georgia as a member of the 88<sup>th</sup> Indiana Regiment to his friend Ira C. Stockbridge in Fort Wayne, Indiana on 3 April 1864. Most of the letter contains True's describes general Union Army troop movement in the South and relates that the war is going well for the North.
