BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Christina Lee Warren was born to Isaac and Mildred Williams Warren on December 24, 1912, the fifth of an eventual twelve children. She grew up on a farm near Indianapolis and attended a one-room schoolhouse until the summer following second grade. At that time the family moved into the city and her father worked at a steel foundry. Christina would eventually attend Crispus Attucks High School, where she would share textbooks with her friends since her family could not afford to purchase them. While still in high school, she became engaged to an acquaintance. She would later break the engagement and marry Fred Ward, an itinerate laborer she had met previously. Christina and Fred were married in 1930 and struggled to make ends meet during the Depression. Fred would later find employment through the WPA.

Four children were born to the union: Alice in 1932, Joanne in 1934, Fred, Jr. in 1936, and Betty in 1938. In 1940, Fred convinced Christina to move the family to Seattle, Washington, where he found work in a shipyard. Fred and Christina raised their family in the Pacific Northwest while keeping in touch with Christina's extensive family in Indiana.

Christina and Fred Ward became involved in the Worldwide Church of God after seeing Herbert W. Armstrong on television. In 1959, Christina began her 17-year career working at a blood bank. Throughout this time and for years afterward, the couple were active in the Church of God. Christina also enjoyed charity volunteer work as well as reading, drawing, crocheting, and flower arranging. She passed away in 2015 at the age of 102.
