## **SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE**

This collection details historic resources from David B. Duvall's personal collection relevant to Indianapolis architecture and historic preservation, most notably including visuals of Lockefield Gardens prior to partial demolition and renovation, early Adolph Scherrer Indianapolis Public School (IPS) renderings, and numerous printed materials. Also included in this collection are 1960s concert ephemera, La Tour restaurant's inaugural menu from 1971, and campaign posters from when Duvall ran for office in the Citizens Party, a third-party campaign, in 1982.
