SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The items in this collection addition were donated by Dianne J. Cartmel in 2007. This addition contains materials related to the Democratic Party and Blish Milling Company in Seymour, Indiana. Democratic Party materials include: a promotional pamphlet for the Democratic Party (1938); the Report of the Credential Committee of the Third Convention of the Young Democratic Clubs of America (1937); and the address of James A. Farley, chairman of Democratic National Committee, at the Third Biennial Convention of the Young Democratic Clubs of America in Indianapolis, Indiana on 20 August 1937.

Materials related to Blish Milling Company include: a company letter regarding the sale of Colonial flour, dated 10 September 1947; a printed image of Blish Milling Company; a partial article of the history of Blish Milling Company; and an educational flyer for Wheat Flour Institute labeling the parts of a wheat kernel. Other miscellaneous materials in this addition are: a Lumbermen's Mutual Casualty Company inspection report, dated 15 January 1942; a program for the General Federation of Women's Clubs Fifty-third Annual Meeting in Saint Louis, Missouri in April 1944; handwritten notes on the history of Corydon and Indiana statehood, including important landmarks; assorted Hoosier Salon news clippings from 1941 and 1943; and two black and white photos of unidentified men.
