BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Edgar Dean Crumpacker (1851–1920) was in Westville, La Porte County, Indiana. After attending Valparaiso Academy, he studied law at Indiana University, was admitted to the bar in 1876, and began his practice in Valparaiso, Porter County. He later worked as the prosecuting attorneys in 31st judicial district of Indiana, and served as appellate judge from 1891-1893. Crumpacker was elected as a Republican to the U. S. House of Representatives in 1897 and served for seven terms. During that time he served as chairman of the Committee on the Census. He lost reelection in 1912 and returned to his law practice in Valparaiso.
