BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Edward Mann Butler (July 13, 1784-November 1, 1855) was born in Baltimore, Maryland. He studied at St. Mary's College, District of Columbia, and earned degrees in both medicine and law. He briefly practiced law in Lexington, Kentucky, but gave it up in 1806. He married Martha Dedman (June 15, 1788-October 4, 1856) in August 1806, and they had two children, Wallace Clark (1833-1926) and Julia A. (1828-1900). Butler began his career as an educator, with various teaching positions at Versailles, Maysville, Frankfort, Jefferson Seminary, Kentucky Seminary, and Transylvania University. In 1829, he became principal of the first public grammar school in Louisville, Kentucky. In 1834, he published A History of the Commonwealth of Kentucky. This text is believed to be the first accurately written history of Kentucky and is still referenced to this day. Also in 1834, he resigned his position as principal, helped found the University of Louisville (formerly Jefferson Seminary), and became its first president. He may also have served as a Justice of the Peace and a notary public. Upon his death, Butler was researching a history of the Ohio River Valley. It is incomplete but is now included in editions of his original commonwealth text. He was killed in a train accident near St. Louis, Missouri. He is buried in Bellefontaine Cemetery in St. Louis, Missouri.
