## **BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH**

Edwin Milroy was from Greenfield, Hancock County, Indiana. In September, 1861, he went to LaPorte, LaPorte County to enlist in Company F of the 9<sup>th</sup> Indiana Regiment which was forming in that area and which contained two of his relatives, Robert and John Milroy. He died on February 26, 1863 in Nashville, Tennessee.

## **SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE**

The collection contains two letters written by Milroy to his uncle, Samuel Milroy, in Greenfield, Hancock County Indiana.

The first letter was written from LaPorte, Laporte County in which he describes his arrival in that city from Greenfield and his enthusiasm for enlisting in the 9<sup>th</sup> Indiana and his relatives, Samuel, Robert and John who were forming companies.

The second letter was from Nashville Tennessee written on 10 December 1862.
