HISTORICAL SKETCH

The 57th Indiana Regiment was organized at Richmond, Indiana, on 18 November 1861. It served in Kentucky and Tennessee, fighting at Chattanooga and Chickamauga. Having served with Sherman in the campaign against Atlanta, it returned to Tennessee to pursue Hood's force, and fought at Franklin and Nashville. After Appomattox the regiment

was sent to Texas, where it was stationed at Port Lavaca near the coast.

SCOPE AND CONTENT

This collection contains one item, a note dated from Lavaca on 13 November 1865. In it Lt. John C. Zollinger of the Quartermaster Corps authorizes transportation for William W. Beauchamp of Company D, 57th Indiana Volunteers, from Lavaca to Indianola.
