BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Calvin Fletcher, Jr., son of Calvin Fletcher, Sr. and Sarah Hill Fletcher, was born on September 30, 1826 in Indianapolis, Indiana. After completing his education at Brown University in Providence, Rhode Island, Calvin Jr. married Emily Beeler. Together, the couple had two sons and three daughters, including daughters Emily Fletcher and Sarah Fletcher Wagner. In 1868, Calvin Jr. purchased a large piece of land in Owen County, Indiana where he built Ludlow Hall. The family moved to Europe in 1874 where they lived for the next three years before returning to Spencer, Indiana in 1877. At the turn of the 20th century, the Fletcher Estate was obtained by E. Chubb Fuller, the publisher of *Agricultural Epitomist*. Calvin Fletcher, Jr. died on January 27, 1903 at the age of 76. He is buried at Crown Hill Cemetery in Indianapolis, Indiana.

Sarah Fletcher Wagner, eldest daughter of Calvin Fletcher, Jr. and Emily Beeler Fletcher, was born on September 29, 1854 in Indianapolis, Indiana. Sarah married Dr. Theodore A. Wagner on September 18, 1879. Together, they had two sons, Fletcher Wagner (1881-) and Herbert Theodore Wagner (1886-1935). Very little is known about Sarah's life. Sarah Fletcher Wagner died on February 13, 1939 at the age of 84. She is buried at Crown Hill Cemetery in Indianapolis, Indiana. In 1904, Sarah's son, Fletcher Wagner, sat for the Rhodes Scholarship examination. After losing the spot to another candidate, Fletcher Wagner returned to school at Harvard University until his disappearance in 1905.

Emily Fletcher, daughter of Calvin Fletcher, Jr. and Emily Beeler Fletcher, was born on October 4, 1857 in Indianapolis, IN. She was a member of the Daughters of the American Revolution and the Chautauqua Scientific and Literary Circle. She never married, and very little is known about her life. Emily Fletcher died in September of 1927 at the age of 69. According to her obituary, she was considered an authority on Indiana history.
