## HISTORICAL SKETCH

The Forty Third Indiana Infantry was organized in Indianapolis on September 1861. In February 1862, it was attached

to General Pope's army in Missouri where it fought in the siege of New Madrid. The Forty Third later distinguished itself in the battle of Helena (July 4, 1863) by capturing a full rebel regiment. After fighting in the battles of Elkins' Ford, Jenkins' Ferry, Camden, and Marks Mills in the spring 1864, the regiment returned to Indianapolis where it was assigned to guard rebel prisoners at Camp Morton. The Forty Third was mustered out on June 14, 1865.
