BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Frank Carl Hazelrigg (January 13, 1864-January 10, 1943) was born in Greensburg, Indiana to John Jay and Gerzella Hazelrigg. Frank lived in Greensburg throughout his youth and graduated from the area high school with honors in 1881.

Immediately after graduation, he began working for the local newspaper, the *Standard*, where his father was a publisher and editor. Frank served as both business manager and as an editor for the paper. Later, he was joined by one of his brothers, who served as a writer. When the office was sold in 1894, the Hazelriggs moved on to other endeavors. Frank authored "The City of Greensburg" in the *Illustrated Souvenir of Greensburg, Indiana, 1894* and served as the superintendent of the Christian Sunday School.

By the time Frank reached middle age, he was living in Indianapolis, Indiana. He held several different jobs, including inventing a tonic alternative and investing in silver mining and real estate. He was also part of the Mystic Tie Lodge No. 398. Additionally, Frank began to travel extensively and photograph the people and places he encountered. During his downtime back home in Indianapolis, he appeared at various club meetings, such as the Kiwanis and the Department Club, to present on his travels. By the end of his life, it was noted that he had visited every continent but Australia.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

This collection is made up of black and white photographs taken on Frank C. Hazelrigg's travels, both foreign and domestic. The photographs are arranged chronologically, and the 1928-1929 photographs are arranged in what could have been the order in which Hazelrigg took his eighteen month trip almost entirely around the world. Hazelrigg documented the scenery and people of the places he visited in the style of a photojournalist, although it seems as though he may have handed over his camera to a companion a time or two, as there are a few photos sprinkled in that show Hazelrigg posing with his subjects. Most of the photographs have identifications or descriptions/commentary from Hazelrigg written on the back. Some place names and territories have changed from the time Hazelrigg visited, so both place names have been acknowledged wherever possible.
