BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Frank Carle Hazelrigg was born in Greensburg, Indiana, on 13 January 1864 to John Jay and Gerzella Hazelrigg. Frank lived in Greensburg throughout his youth and graduated from the area high school with honors in 1881.

Immediately after graduation, he began working for the local newspaper, the *Standard*, where his father was a publisher and editor. Frank served as both business manager and as an editor for the paper. Later, he was joined by one of his brothers, who served as a writer. When the office was sold in 1894, the Hazelriggs moved on to other endeavors. Frank authored "The City of Greensburg" in the *Illustrated Souvenir of Greensburg, Indiana, 1894* and also served as the superintendent of the Christian Sunday School. His father and brother went into the pharmacy business; later, Frank joined them.

By the time Frank reached middle age, he was living in Indianapolis, Indiana. He held several different jobs, including inventing a tonic alternative and investing in silver mining and real estate. In his 60s, Frank began to travel. Through cruises, he traveled around the world and documented the sights using photography. He also wrote travelogues for the *Indianapolis Star*.

He died on 10 January 1943 of a heart attack.
