BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Frank Wallace Summers (1923–1986) was born in Indianapolis, Indiana. His grandfather, William Wallace Spencer, was involved with writing the election laws for the state of Indiana. Frank married Juanita Mae Coleman and they had five children. Mr. Summers moved to the Richmond, Indiana, area in 1953.

During World War II, Summers served with the 4th Troop Carrier Squadron of the 12th Air Force in North Africa, Sicily, and Italy. He attained the rank of sergeant.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The bulk of the collection consists of correspondence between Frank Wallace Summers serving with the U.S. Army Air Corps and his siblings Harriett Bartlett, Bill Summers, and Janie Summers in Indianapolis, Indiana, 1940–46. Frank writes from training camps and schools including Ft. Benjamin Harrison (near Indianapolis); Iowa City, Iowa; McClellan Field (near Sacramento California); Florence, South Carolina; and Kellogg Field, Michigan. Most of these letters contain humorous sketches and describe his training, classes, and leisure time, August 1940–August 1942.

This letter exchange continues when Summers is shipped overseas with the 4th Troop Carrier Squadron of the 12th Air Force in England (September–November 1942); North Africa (December 1942–August 1943); Sicily (December 1943–January 1944); and Italy (February 1944–Aug. 1945). Summers discusses his daily activities, the places he was assigned to, and light-hearted subjects in his world. He states that he neither blames nor dislikes the German soldier that they were only trying to do their jobs unless they are dropping bombs on him.

Postwar correspondence includes cards and family correspondence from 1946 and 1960. There also are a number of copies of special orders issued by Summers' unit that involves his assignments, unit citations, promotions, and awards such as the Good Conduct Medal.

The papers also contain documents and printed materials relevant to Summers's military career. There are various identification cards, orders, and passes, many of which are from his assignment in Italy. There also are programs, flyers, and other types of remembrances from performances and tourist attractions visited by Summers while in the military including the Soldiers Guide for both North Africa and Italy.
