BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Franklin A. Burkhart was born in September 1880 to Andrew Burkhart and Laura Cornelius. He was one of seven children. He married Gurnith M. Church in Jackson, Missouri on 4 April 1915. They eventually moved to Missouri. Like his father, Franklin worked as a farmer. He died on 11 September 1966 in Kansas City, Missouri.

William E. Burkhart was born on 20 February 1878 to Andrew Burkhart and Laura Cornelius. William married Laura Pariden on 27 May 1924 in Indiana. He was also a farmer. William died on 20 July 1965 in Indianapolis, Indiana.
