HISTORICAL SKETCH

Franklin County, Indiana was organized in February 1811 from a division of Dearborn County. By 1820, the county had a population of 10,703 people and in 1830 the population was 10,990. The county seat is located in Brookville and houses the Franklin County circuit court. The circuit court appointed minor officials including listers, referred to as assessors after 1828. Enoch McCarty served as the first county clerk of court and recorder from 1811 until 1817, then just as clerk of court until 1831. George Holland served as clerk and as an assessor in 1833.

The assessments were used for determining property taxes for township residents. The 1819 assessment was made by Enoch McCarty (McCarty). The 1833 assessment was made by George Holland.
