## HISTORICAL SKETCH

The Memorial Day Parade of the American Legion took place on May 30, 1922 in downtown Indianapolis, Indiana. The announcement regarding who was chosen to lead the parade was in the *Indiana Daily Times* on February 27, 1922. The group leading the parade was the George Dewey Post #3 located in Marion County. The pictures show only this group of men in this parade. Signs of the groups say:

“Geo. Dewey Post #3”

“The Only Navy Post in Indiana”

“Rise & Shine Sailors”
