Pogue was a blacksmith in North Carolina and settled by the White River in present-day Indianapolis, Indiana (1819).

The collection consists of the George Pogue family's receipts, bills, and a small amount of personal correspondence, primarily from the period 1820–36. Also included are account books for a Cumberland (Marion County), Ind., tavern run by Samuel Fullen, George Pogue's son-in-law (1828, 1832).
