SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

Papers of Gerry Tyrrell related to being gay in 1980's Indiana. Papers derive from Earlham College, a liberal arts school in Richmond, Indiana, between 1985-1987. Original order maintained; collection is in good condition. The first two folders include a letter and a speech, followed by folders with materials from the Lesbian Gay Peoples Union of Earlham College. The remaining three folders contain Tyrrell's college papers.

Tyrrell's first paper is a study on what LGBT-identity means in adult development, particularly regarding childrearing. He concludes that childrearing issues for gays revolve around the challenge of acquiring children via adoption whereas lesbians stressed the difficulties and societal pressures around having and raising children.

The second paper explores the psychological phases of identity formation, predominantly for gay men. He critiques the cultural assumption of heterosexuality in society. Tyrrell concludes that gay men suffer from identity incongruence and discrepancy based on society's attitude towards homosexuality.

Tyrrell's third paper is a critique on sexual orientation research. He explores the seven components of sexual orientation for both males and females that are heterosexual, gay/lesbian, and bisexual. Tyrrell draws some conclusions regarding identity formation, stating that each category has a unique identity and orientation experience.
