BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Harl D. Brown, Jr. (ca 1920-1971) enlisted in the Civilian Conservation Corps in 1937 and served three six-month terms. His occupation was listed as a laborer. He enlisted in the Navy, and was at Pearl Harbor during the Japanese

attack on 7 December 1941. He was on a ship which was torpedoed, and all the bones of his feet and legs were crushed. Though he later learned to walk, with great difficulty, he continued to be treated in several Veterans Hospitals.
