BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

W. A. Holland and then his sons [T. A. Holland](#) and F. W. Holland were in business with George B. Jackson in the 1890s in Leesville, in eastern Lawrence County, Indiana. Jackson sold out in 1899, and the business continued in the

name of T. A. and F. W. Holland at Fort Ritner, in southeastern Lawrence County; their checks read "General Merchandise and Proprietor of The Diamond Roller Mills." F. W. Holland's name was dropped about 1910.

By 1918 T. A. Holland was living at 1134 Lincoln Street in Bedford. His son, Ray Holland (born 1899) received a draft notice in 1918 and obtained a chauffeur's license in 1921 (signed by Ed Jackson, Secretary of State). Letters of 1923 and 1928 indicate that Ray Holland, living away from home, was receiving help from his father.
