HISTORICAL SKETCH

John Edward Coletto served in the 139th Field Artillery Band, 38th Division, Camp Shelby, Mississippi during World War II. During this time, he wrote a newspaper column entitled "Shelby Shorts" to update civilians on the camp's happenings. Coletto was from Crawfordsville, Indiana.
