BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

John P. Quinn was born in Harrison, Ohio around 1843 and moved to Adams County with his family, Indiana where he farmed. In August, 1862, he enlisted in Company H. of the 89th Indiana Regiment with the rank of corporal and was promoted to sergeant in June, 1864. Quinn was mustered out in July, 1865, and returned to Adams County where he studied law and became a partner of Judge Studabaker. In February, 1871, he married Uritta Long and they had three sons.
