BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Joseph M. Stricker was born in 1837 to Bavarian immigrants Franciscus and Francisca [Sertel/Settle] Stricker. The 1850 census shows another five siblings all living on a farm in Dearborn County. In 1858, Joseph married Anna Maria Gottwalles, born in Bavaria in 1836. The couple settled in North Vernon. They had two children: Pauline (1860-1926) and Joseph F., known as Frank J. Stricker (1861-1908), who was killed in Cincinnati while working as a switchman on the B&O Railroad.

In February 1864 Joseph enlisted in the war as a 1st Lieutenant. He was commissioned into 'C' Company of the 13th Indiana Cavalry. He served for the rest of the war and was promoted to Captain on 1 May 1864.

After the war he held various occupations. In 1870 he was running a grist mill in North Vernon. The 1880 census finds him working as a sawyer in Evansville. By 1900 he had settled into a job as a grocery merchant back in North Vernon, which he did for the rest of his life. Anna died in 1911. Joseph died in 1926.
