BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

<u>Josephine Robinson</u> (1868-1951) was born in Chicago, the daughter of Joseph R. and Elizabeth Yandes Robinson. She attended Indianapolis High School, and was the first of its graduates to enter Vassar College, which she attended for one year. She studied music in Indianapolis, Cincinnati, and New York, and became a well-known vocal soloist. She organized a chorus at the Y. W. C. A., and was soloist at the Second Presbyterian Church in Indianapolis. She was a member of the Second Church of Christ, Scientist, and was listed as a Christian Science practitioner.

From about 1925 Robinson lived with her two sisters, Anna Belle and Mary Yandes Robinson, at 1801 North

Pennsylvania Street, in a house previously occupied by Henry L. Beveridge, president of Beveridge Paper Company.

Robinson was a granddaughter of Indianapolis pioneer Daniel Yandes, and wrote a biography of him and his family (Crawfordsville, 1936).
