BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Lannes McPhetridge (1868-1936) was born in Danville, Hendricks County, Indiana. In November, 1900, he married Jessie M. Sweet of Indianapolis. McPhetridge worked as a journalist, writer, and publisher in Indianapolis before moving to Los Angeles, California in the 1920s. In addition to writing, McPhetridge was an active horticulturist.
