HISTORICAL SKETCH

Lone Star Industries, Inc. was incorporated in Maine in 1919 as International Cement Corporation and, in 1936, changed its name to Lone Star Cement Corporation. The company opened its Indiana division circa 1924. In 1969, Lone Star Cement changed its state of incorporation to Delaware and in 1971 changed its name to Lone Star Industries, Inc. As of December 2000, the corporation is headquartered in Stamford, Connecticut. The sales, marketing, and operations office for the company is located in Indianapolis.

Lone Star Industries operates one of its five plants in Putnam County, Indiana near Greencastle on 3301 S County Road 150 W, approximately 40 miles southwest of Indianapolis. A portion of the Greencastle plant's production is a high quality Type III portland cement.

BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCHES

George E. Pierson began his career at Lone Star's Kansas division on 15 August 1924 and transferred to Indiana "shortly thereafter." He began with the company as a sales manager and before becoming the company's vice president and manager of the Indiana division. He retired on 15 August 1949.

Carl Erdman was the Greencastle plant superintendant. He retired 1 August 1948, having started at the Greencastle plant in April 1933, coming from the company's Hudson Plant.

I. C. Brotzman was supertendant of Lone Star's Birmingham plant before becoming the company's general superintendent in late 1944 and domestic operations manager in 1947. He worked from the company's New York office, but often visited the Greencastle plant.

A. C. Harragin was Lone Star's comptroller based in the New York office who also visited the Greencastle plant.

Fred C. Shrieber was the general superindentant by 1947, working from the New York office but regularly visiting the Greencastle plant.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

IHS received the collection material in random order, so the processor arranged the material chronologically. Some of the documents bear the name "Harragin," and could be the material's likely provenance.

Folder 1 contains two typed, carbon copies of the March 1946 production report written by plant superindendant C. Erdman to company Vice President G. E. Pierson in Indianapolis. The report includes five photographs adhered to some of its pages. The two reports were originally stapled together, thus the processor stored in them in the same folder. The first copy has Mr. Harragin's name written in pencil on the upper left corner; the second copy, "Mr. Brotzman." The processor removed the staples for reasons of conservation.

Folder 2 contains two photographs on a loose page from a 1946 report and depict the construction of a floor for an addition to the plant.

Folder 3 contains a three pages with five photographs dated 26 September 1949 illustrating construction, a recording tachometer, and a spout and rotary valve.

Folders 4 and 5 contains separate copies of the same report; one for "Mr. Schieber," another for "Harragin." Both names on these reports are crossed through. Each report has it's own folder because, unlike the reports in Folder 1, they were not stapled together.

Folder 6 contains four interior photographs by Hirschburg, not dated. Captioned photographs in Folders 4 and 5 identify these images as various rooms within the newly constructed Service Building, circa 1949. Folder 7 contains an exterior view of the building, likewise identified from an image in Folders 4 and 5.

Folder 8 contains two photographs adhered onto one sheet of paper entitled "Greencastle First-aid Room." Examining the photographs from the verso of the sheet with backlighting reveals typed captions on the verso of the photographs that place the room in the "new service building," and are dated 6 March 1950.

Folder 9 contains seven photographs dated 15 November 1950 depicting quarry excavation. The processor removed five of the photographs from loose sheet of paper because of failing adhesive. Two of the three sheets were entitled "Greencastle – 1950."

Folder 10 contains four sheets with twelve photographs. Whether the sheets were part of one report or more was not evident, so the processor brought them together by year. The verso of an 8" x 10" photograph has an ink-stamped form (filled in) that reads:

Folder 11 contains four bird's-eye views of the Greencastle plant by Fairchild Aerial Surveys, Inc. The processor removed these photographs from the acidic paper onto which they were mounted because of failing adhesive. Two of the photographs are very similar in appearance, but close examination reveals additional buildings on the site. Negative numbers suggest Fairchild Aerial Surveys made the earlier view in 1950 and the late views in 1956.

Folder 12 contains one sheet with two mounted exterior view photographs of the crusher building on 27 March 1957.

Folder 13 contains four photographs dated 1967 showing excavation on the site for a crusher seventy-two feet below the surface, the construction of clinker silo foundations, and an overall bird's-eye view of the clinker silo construction site on 30 September.
