BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

The patriarch and matriarch of the Mohr family featured in this album are Uriah Mohr (February 5, 1859-March 9, 1937) and Christina Gangwer Mohr (December 20, 1863-July 21, 1950). Uriah was the son of Jonas and Helena Mohr, and Christina was the daughter of William and Lydia Gangwer. The couple married on November 17, 1883, and settled on a farm in Center Township, Clinton County, near Frankfort, Indiana. They raised a daughter, Pearl, and two sons, Carl and Samuel.

Pearl Mohr (January 22, 1885-January 12, 1941) married Lawrence Norris (March 4, 1880-September 5, 1937), also of Frankfort, Indiana in November 1903. The Norris family owned a farm and the couple had one daughter, Ruth.

Carl Mohr (August 11, 1887-September 13, 1966) married Retha Milner (September 1, 1892-April 21, 1988). Carl owned an auto dealership in Frankfort. He and Retha had two sons, William and Robert.

Samuel D. Mohr (March 6, 1892-August 1979) married Mabel Rex (March 26, 1897-April 19, 1981). The couple had a farm near Frankfort, Indiana. They had two children, Donald and Irene Jane.
