## BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Odeda Z. Katz Rosenthal was born on November 5, 1934. She was born and raised in Jerusalem and grew up speaking three languages. Her family moved to New York City. She earned a BA from The City College of New York, and an MA from Hunter College in Comparative Languages. She married Abner Rosenthal. She wrote articles originally for the East Hampton Star. She co-authored *Coping with Colourblindness* in 1997. She also wrote *Not Strictly Kosher: Pioneer Jews of New Zealand* in 1991. She translated *Where is Tanya?* by Zina Gurland into English. She taught art for a while, as well. She published a collection of poems, *Never Said I Was a Lady*, in 1983. She wrote a column for the New York Times called the Long Island Opinion from 1984-1989. She wrote a pamphlet entitled, *Hedwig Michel: The Patron Saint of The Koreshan State Historic Site* for the Koreshan Unity Foundation, Inc. in 1992. She taught at a community college in Long Island for some time. She died June 25, 2007.
